What is 'sexting'?

Sexting is the sending of sexually explicit messages via mobile phones or computers. It is often coercive and is linked to sexual harassment, bullying and even violence.

Images can also be used later as a form of harassment and abuse known as 'revenge pornography' which involves distribution (or threat of) of images without consent, to threaten, control, bully, harm or humiliate.
